Salaries and Fees.

When our new Board of Aldermen come to fix the salaries for the next two years, it is hoped they will make themselves familiar with what they are doing before perpetuating the present exhorbitant fees. For instance the clerk is allowed to collect a fee of one dollar on a license which the city only charges \$2,50 for. And again the Chief of Police gets a commission on collecting about \$12,000, a fee of \$1 on every conviction or submission and a salary of \$720 per annum. How much the commission amounts to is not stated in any of the reports or ordinances and how much the fines amount to is equally as uncertain. I am not opposed to a salary sufficient for the work done; but think it should be a definite sum and not a contingent sum; and the new Board should familiarize themselves with what they term "salary and fees" means before they fix the compensation for the next two years.

Hebrews Exiled

What does all this persecution of the Jews mean? They are without protection the world over, and any power that sees fit can persecute and ostracise them with impunity. Is there a providence in it? The following speaks for itself.

ODESSA, April 30 .- Eight hundred Jewish families have been ordered to quit Kieff forthwith. The well-to-do have already gone, but the poor artisan classes are in the greatest straits. Many are arriving on the Austrian frontier in a destitute condition, but the Austrian officials refuse domicile to paupers.

The Kieff police accept no excuse, raiding the city with the utmost severity unless bribed to delay action. The daily expulsions from Moscow number from 100 to 150. On Sunday an exceptional raid was made when 690 were expelled. The rigor of the authorities frightens away many entitled to permanent resi-

The effect is felt even in the city, which is a great centre for Jews with permits to engage in business. The

emigration of Jews from this city has quadrupled. Permits guaranteed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Minister of Finance and the Minister of the Interior, any one of whom has power to quash their tenure, are con sidered of precarious value, and the principals of large Jewish firms are placing their business in the hands of Russian agents and are themselves
