A Summer Resort in Flames.

The well known and popular summer resort Seabright, on the coast of New Jersey was destroyed by fire on the night of the 16th. Four hundred buildings were burned. A large portion of the town is reduced to ashes and several hundred families are rendered homeless. The loss is estimated at not less than \$500,000.

Died in a Solitary Orgie.

J. C. C. Burnett who was appointed to a clerkship in the Census office at Washington, D. C., about a year ago was found dead on his bed in a room which he occupied alone, on Tuesday afternoon. A partially emptied bottle of whiskey found in his room, showed how he died. He leaves a wife and two children, who live at Norfolk, Va.

FIGHTING WITH A HORSE.

THE ANIMAL HAD HYDROPHOBIA AND NEARLY KILLED A MAN.

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., June 15—Dr. John Clarke, of Waldo, had a terrible adventure last evening with a horse which had hydrophobia. Clarke had ridden the animal to visit a patient, and was hitching it to the limb of a tree when the horse sprang upon him, knocking him down.

The doctor succeeded in getting up and behind the tree, but the horse followed him and chased him round and round the tree. Assistance arrived just when Clarke was ready to sink from exhaustion, and the horse was shot.—Philadelphia Record.
