Between the mouth of the Mispis sippi river and Galveston, Texas, ten or fifteen miles south of Sabine Pass, is a spot in the Gulf of Mexico which by the captains of the small crafts which ply in that vicinity Thare no land within fifteen miles, but tven in the. wildest weather the water at this spot is comparatively oil which apparently rises from the bed of the gulf, whieh is here about ifteen to eighteen feet beneath th surface. This strange refuge is wel known to the sailors who run on the small vessels trading between Cal caslen, Orange, Sabine, Beaumon
and Galvestcn. When through stres of weather they fail to make harbor elsewhere, they run for "the Oil Ponds," let go the anchor and ride
