A Young Girl's Strange Insanity.

SUMMIT, N. J., August 7.—Maggie O'Rourke, 15 years of age, daughter of the late Joseph O'Rourke, was taken to the State Insane Asylum at Morris Plains today. The cause of her insanity is not known. About two weeks ago she suddenly disappeared from her home here, and every effort to locate her for a number of days proved futile. At last her mother sent a telegram to Bridgeport, where two of her uncles reside, and the answer revealed her whereabouts. One of her uncles returned to Summit with her on Friday morning. On Saturday she attempted suicide by throwing herself in front of a railroad train. Her mother saved her life at the risk of her own by dragging her from before the loco motive. Doctors Rusk and Lawrence testified before Judge Wiley at Elizabeth yesterday that the girl was insane, and her removal to the asylum was accomplished as soon as the papers were made out.

Want Negroes Excluded From The G. A. R. Encampment.

CHICAGO, August 8.—Among the delegations to the Grand Army Encampment at Detroit arrived in the city yesterday was that of the Department of Louisiana and Mississippi. Comrade A. S. Graham and others of the delegates say in published interviews that they are going to Detroit to make an issue on the exclusion of negroes from the Grand Army ranks and they declare that unless their demand is acceded to, they will withdraw from the organization. They say they expect to have animated opposition from the Northern parties.
