PARKERSBURG, W. Va., Sept. 6.—Gen. T. M. Harris, of Ritchie county, a member of the court martial which investigated the death of Lincoln and condemned Mrs. Surratt, has just finished a history of the assassination of President Lincoln. The history was compiled from the stenographer's notes, which are in General Harris' possession. In the book General Harris boldly charges that Jefferson Davis and certain members of his Cabinet were interested in and encouraged the assassination of Lincoln. Sweeping Changes in Glass Making.

WHEELING, W. Va., Sept. 6.—It is announced here that the United States Glass Company, the combine into which all the glass factories of the Ohio Valley were recently merged, will begin at once to make a sweeping change in glass manufacture. Hereafter all the molds to be used in the various factories of the trust will be made in their factories—one in Pittsburg, one in Wheeling and one in Fostoria, Ohio. The mold shops in over 25 other factories will be closed down. The change will throw over 1,000 mold makers out of employment.
