A Suggestion.

Much difficulty has been encountered in the past few days, especially by persons who patronize the street cars, in determining which cars to take for the different routes. It requires all sorts of questioning to find out, for instance, which cars run on Blount street, and which on Hillsboro street. In consequence of the routes not being designated on the cars, persons frequently get wrong and only find out their mistake when reaching the corner of Salisbury and Hillsboro street where the lines branch off. Now, it seems to us there is a very simple remedy which should be supplied. It is to place on the cars the names of the routes for which they are destined, so that passengers can see at a glance which to take. A plain piece of canvas tacked on each coach with the words "Hillsboro street car," or "Blount str et car," would remedy the matter. It should be done by all means. It would avoid much trouble both to the conductors and the public.
