Cotton is used more by poor meu than by the rich. The rich wear very little conton goods wool, silk and linen entering principally in the goods worn by them. Cotton supplies the wants of the poor man. If he is unable to purchase it, even when it is cheaper than usual, it makes the price of cotton still cheaper, and this has much to do with the present price of cotton.

Let the furmers of Georgia and the south resolve to make enough on their farms on which to live at home and make cotton their surplus crop, and they will not suffer as much by overproduction or low price.-Atlanta Constitution.
