It has been over 1,503 years since re rule was adopted which makes Easter the first Sunday after the first fall moon atter tha sun erosees the lide. By this arrangement of thiogs Easter may exme as esrly as March 22 or as late as April 25. As all the readers of the News, foreign born or native, have some superstitions converning this feast day, we have com piled the following facts concerning the days of the month upon which it has fallen from 1803 to 1891 , inelusive In looking over the dates we have been struek by the variety of day represented, which include every one in the month of April except the las in it." since the date above, are "no in it." since the date mentioned (1808) 19th, five times on the 16th, five time on che 1st, four times each on the on che 18t, four times each on the
2ad, 11th and 12th. four times on Mareh 31, four times on April 6, three times on the 4 th, 5 th, 7 th, 8 th, 10 th 13th, 11 th and 23 od of April and 27 th and 28th of March. March 22nd, 1818 , was the earliest date upon which it has occurred. Nine days in March are represented, viz: 22nd, 23rd, 25th,
26th, 27th, 28th, 29th, 30th and 31 st , 26th, 27th, 28th, 29th, 80th and 31st.
