**A LIVELY GHOST.**

 LAKE CHARLES, La., May 18—A ghost of exceptionally lively and jocose nature is agitating the vicinity of what is known the old Cross Road by its midnight shrieks of laughter and bursts of hilarity. The Cross Roads is a small settlement lying four miles south of this town, where two old county roads formerly met. The people say that every night between 12 o'clock and 1 they are suddenly awakened by a great noise of shouting and shrieks as of many voices. Then a single voice, apparently a man's, takes up the task of making the night sleepless. The laughter seems that of a person in a great glee or intoxicated, but invariably ends in a loud scream of anger or pain.  
 After this nothing more is heard until the same hour on the next night. Every effort has been made by the people to penetrate the mystery of this occurrence, but up to date no solution has been found. One peculiarity is that the laughter seems to be in each house and to be as distinctly heard in one as another. It is apparently the noise of a person seated on the roof or shouting through the ceiling. Various surmises are afloat as to the identity of the returned spirit, but though addressed by the names of all whom it could possibly be, no response is to be won from it. It is generally believed, however, to be the ghost of a peddler who, in a drunken frolic, was killed by a prominent planter for some silly jest. This mystery has been puzzling the people for something over a week now.
