The Summer Sewing School.

For several years a number of the ladies of this city, feeling the need of some industrial training for the chil. dren of the town, have conducted a Sewing School. This year, this work has been placed on a more satisfactory basis than ever before. Old plans of work have been extended and new features added. Under the superintendence of Miss Mary Marsh, who has made a most successful record as a teacher in the Marphy school, the sewing school will open in the Centennial graded school, June 21st, at 9 o'clock. The school will be held from 9 to 11 o'clock, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays during June, July and August. To cover cost of materials used, a charge of twenty cents a month in advance will be made for each pupil. Girls from seven to sixteen admitted.
