He prospered at this and finally got a contract to extract ore from the Chollar mine on a certain royalty. This was the foundation of his fortune.

As a means of naval defense the proposed ship canal between the Delaware river and New York Bay would unquestionably be worth many times its cost in the event of a foreign war; while in time of peace the tolls from traffic on such a waterway would go far toward defraying expenses of care and maintenance and paying interest on cost of construction. This is one of the few public enterprises in which the nation might reasonably engage with a fair prospect of coming out whole on the right side of the account.

**HOW FAST CAN THE DUMB SPEAK?**

The deaf and dumb, as every one knows, "speak" by means of their fingers. How many words, then, can a good hand speaker form in a minute? According to the Postal Telegraph Department the average number of letters per word in the English language is five. Now, a really hand speaker can make the English alphabet ten times in a minute—that is to say 260 letters. It is usual for him to make for the space of one letter after each word to show that the word is complete. If, therefore, we subtract from the total just given about one sixth for these stoppages, the total will be reduced to 212 letters. Let this be divided by five, the average number of letters per word, and we shall find that a fairly expert deaf and dumb person will speak forty three words per minute. A person in possession of speech will probably speak 150 of words in the same space of time.

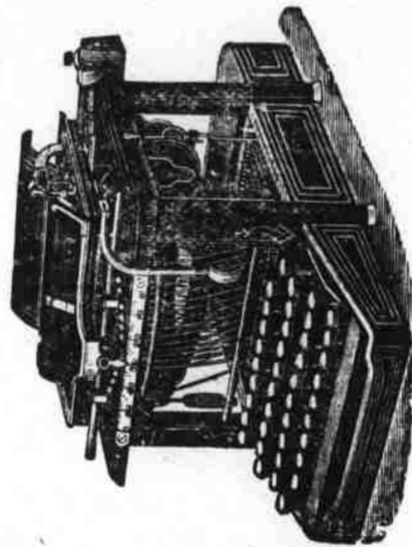
