

City Ordinance.

We have been requested to print the following section from an ordinance of the city, and to announce that its provisions w'l be rigidly en forced.

Section 10. "No bog sty shall be located within 25 feet of any public street within the city or within 25 feet of premises of others than the owner or within 25 feet of any well or spring or other water used for drinking or culinary purposes, or any natural drain or gutter within the city limits; and if such sty shall be located contrary to the meaning of this ordinance, and the persons offending fail to remove it within two days, on being notified to do so by the chief of police, he shall be fined five dollars."

Heretofore this ordinance has only been enforced when complaints were made, but we are informed by the chief of police that from now on he will rigedly enforce the above or . d'uance.
