## City Ordinance

We have been requested to print the, following saction irom an ordi. pa.nce of the city, and to announce
that its provisions $w^{\wedge} 1$ be rigidly en orced.
Section 10. "No bog sty shall be lo cated within 25 feet of any public street within the eity or withiu 25 leet of premises of others than the wner or within 25 feet of any well or spring or other water used for drinking or calinary parposes, or any oataral drain or gutter within the ity limits; and if such sty shall bu his ordinance the meaning fending fall to menore it within two days, on being notifled to do ao by the chiet of
five dollars."
