The Senate has been the mill into which the floodgates have been open ed and a slicen of petitions protest. ing sadost c.gar tee has rushed into it during the whole of the present session of Congress. Senator Harris. to the committe on epidemic diseas - o which ne of these petitions was referred, has made a report. The committee ega I the use of clgare ettes as decide ly bijurious to the youth of the contry, and feel called upon to suggest that some remedy be found to correct the evil. In the light of such information as the committee has been able to obtain from sciencists of the country it is of the op'ulon that the use of tobacco in any form is inju jous to the physical condition of man, and that eigerette smoking is more injurious, especially to youths, than the use of tobacco in any other form, and that the medicated eigarette is more injurious than the pure tobacco

The committee is satisfied that Congress has no constitutional power to probibit the manufacture or sale of eigarettes in the States, but ventures the opinion and the hope that Congress will prohibit the importation from foreign counties and the manufacture and sale of eigarettes in the District of Columbia, as well as in the Territories.


