

The Fall Outlook.
We have had occasion during the past few days to interview some of our foremost business men as to the trade outlook for the coming fall and winter, and find that, in every instance, the most cheerful results are anticipated. While it is true that business has been somewhat stagnant for a month or so past, we are assured that there are already signs of recuperation to a greater extent than is usual at this time of the year. It is now almost beyond doubt, that in the absence of some unexpected disaster, the crops, the present season, will be fully up or, perhaps, beyond the average. This is specially true of the cereals of which a larger acreage than formerly has been planted. We are assured, too, that thus far the cotton crop bids fair to return a handsome yield. As an evidence that the most confident feeling exists, some of our merchants tell us they will purchase heavier stocks than for some years past, and that their shelves are cleaner of spring and summer goods than generally in the month of July. In fact, there are cheerful signs all around.
