IN A BIG ICE DRIFT.

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—The ship, New City (of St. John, N. B.), from Taital, which arrived here today, reports June 20th at 2 p. m., sighted two immense ice islands, one we judge to be 900 feet high; at 5 p. m. there were nine in sight, some very large; during the night we sighted thirteen; at daylight we counted nineteen from the masthead, one we judged to be ten miles long and 150 feet high and flat on top.
 This ice drift appeared to lay in an east and west direction, and sixty miles north and south, there is no doubt that this ice will drift to the northward of latitude 40° before it reaches the Cape of Good Hope.
