Some interesting results concerning the transplanting of oaks were mentioned in a recent paper read before the Edinburgh Botanical'Society. A number of trees were transplanted at an early age, some later, and some left in the seed bed. Measurements of their girth, taken annually since 1809, show conclusively that the transplanted oaks are ahead at least fifty years of the others. Merely lifting the trees was also found to make them mature rapidly.

Here is another chance for the collectors of historical relics for the World's Fair.
