RALEIGH IN THE WOODS!

Place of Residence of the Chief Officers of the State.

AN ORDINANCE PASSED AT THE CONVENTION HELD IN HILLSBORO 1787.

WHEREAS the Delegates of the people of North Carolina in Convention met at Hillsborough, in July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight, agreeable to recommendation of the General Assembly of the State, passed in Tarborough, in December, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, for the purpose of establishing a place for the holding the future meetings of the General Assembly, and the place of residence of the chief officers of the State (exclusive of their appointment to deliberate and determine on the new constitution proposed for the government of the United States) did ordain and establish the plantation whereon Isaac Hunter then resided, in Wake county, or some place within ten miles of the said plantation to be the unalterable place for the above purposes, leaving to the General Assembly to ascertain the spot within the limits aforesaid:

I. Be it enacted, &c. That nine persons be elected by joint ballot of both houses of the General Assembly provided nevertheless, that there shall be one Commissioner from each district in the said number; and they or a majority of them are hereby authorized and directed to view the county within the limits aforesaid and determine on the spot or place most proper for the purposes above mentioned; and to contract with and purchase from the owner or owners the place they shall fix and determine on, together with not less than six hundred and forty, and not more than one thousand acres of land thereto adjoining; and to take a deed or deeds to the Governor for the time being and his successors, for the benefit of the State, from such owner or owners; and for payment of the purchase money to draw on the Treasurer for the amount in favour of the grantor or grantors; which drafts the Treasurer is hereby directed to pay, and shall be allowed for same in settlement, any law to the contrary notwithstanding. And the said Commissioners are further directed to survey and lay off a town to be erected at the place and on the lands aforesaid, and to contain four hundred acres at least; in doing which they are to observe that the lots be one acre lots, and the main streets ninety nine feet wide, and the other streets not less than fifty six feet wide; and to allot twenty lots or more, as they may judge necessary, in the most pleasant and commodious parts of the town, for a State house and other public buildings. And the said Commissioners are hereby authorized to sell and dispose of the remaining lots at public vendue, either on credit or for ready money as they may deem most convenient or advantageous for the State; and are hereby fully authorized and empowered to make all necessary deeds and conveyances to secure the fee simple of the said lots to the purchasers; and a majority of said Commissioners are hereby declared competent to all the purposes and authorities intended and given by this act.

II. And be it further enacted, That five persons be elected by the joint ballot of both houses of the General Assembly, and they or a majority of them, are hereby authorized and directed to cause to be built and erected on the most proper lot, or part of the public lots, a statehouse, sufficient large to accommodate with convenience both houses of the General Assembly when sitting on public business; and they are hereby required to have the same built on such a plan that additions may be hereafter conveniently made when necessary; and the Governor for the time being is hereby authorized and required to issue warrants on the Treasurer, from time to time in favour of the said Commissioners as he may be requested by them or a majority of them, for the purpose of discharging the expense of building the said statehouse, taking security for double the sum to be drawn for the faithful application of the same as by this act directed. Provided nevertheless, That the whole amount of warrants so drawn shall not exceed the sum of ten thousand pounds. And the said first mentioned Commissioners are directed to make or cause to be made a plan of the said town; and the said last mentioned Commissioners shall make or cause to be made a plan of the State-house, together with a plan of such other public buildings as they may deem proper and necessary to be hereafter built; and they shall lay the same and all their proceedings respectively under this act before the next General Assembly; and each and every of the Commissioners shall be allowed for their trouble and expense twenty shillings per day, for every day while they are actually serving, besides all other reasonable charges.

III. And be it further enacted by

the authority aforesaid, That the place which the said Commissioners or a majority of them, shall determine on, shall be the seat of government, and the unalterable place of holding the future assemblies of this State, and the place of residence of the chief officers of the State, agreeable to the true intent and meaning of the recommendation of the General Assembly, and the ordinance of the Convention herein before mentioned. Provided always, That no convenient buildings can be erected on the said place for the purposes aforesaid, the General Assembly from time to time shall have power to appoint any other place or places for the meeting of the General Assembly and for the residence of the chief officers of the State, notwithstanding this law.
