RALEIGH IN THE WOODS!

Place of Residence of the Chief Officers of the State.

AN ORDINANCE PASSED AT THE CONVENTION HELD IN HILLSBORO 1787.

WHEREAS the Delegates of the people of Neith Carolina in Co vention met at Billfborough in July, one thousand feven hundred and eighty eight, agreeable to recommendation of the General Affembly of the ftate, psffed in Tarborough, in December, one thousand feven hundred and eighty-feven, for the purpose of establishing a place for the holding the future meetings of the General Affembly, and the place of refidence of the chief officers of the ftate (exclusive of their ap pointment to deliberate and deter mine on the new conftitution propofed for the government of the United States) did ordain and eftablifh the plantation wher on Ifage Hunter then refided, in Wake county, or fome place within ten miles of the faid plantation to be fhe upalterable place for the above purpofes, leaving to the General Affembly to afcertain the fpot within the limits aforefail: I. Be it eracted, &c . That nine

perfons be elected by joint hallot of both houses of the deneral Affembly Provided neverthelefs, that there fhall be one Commissioner from each diffrict in the faid number; and they or a majority of them are herety anthorifed and directed to view the coupty within the limits aforefaid and determine on the fpot or place most proper for the purposes above mentioned; and to contract with and purchase from the owner or owners the place the place they fhall fo fix and determine on, together with not lefs than fix hundred and forty, and not more than one thousand acres of land thereto adjoining; and to take a deed or deeds to the Hovernor for the time being and his fucceffors, for the benefit of the ftate, from fuch owner or owners; and for payment of the purchase money to dr won the Trea furer for the amount in favour of the grantor or grantors; which drafts the Treafurer is hereby directed to pay, and fhall be allowed for fame in fettlement, any law to the contrary not withstanding And the faid Com-miffioners are further directed to far vey and lay off a town to be erected at the place and on the lauds afore. faid, and to contain four hundred acres at leaft; in doing which they are to observe that the lots be one acre lots, and the main ftreets ninety nine feet wide, and the other ftreets not lefs than fifty fix feet wide; and to allot twenty lots or more, as they may judge neceffary, in the most pleafant and commodious parts of the town, for a ftate house and other pub lie buildings. And the faid Commissioners are hereby authorifed to fell and difpofe of the remaining lots at public vendue, either on credit or for ready money as they may deem the triumphs of other days. Chic, most convenient or advantageous for the ftate; and are hereby fully authorized and empowered to make all neceffary deeds and conveyances to fecure the fee fimple of the faid lots to the purchafers; and a majority of faid Commiffioners are hereby declared competent to all the purposes | man; the sauerkraut eating Dutchand authorities intended and given by this act.

II And be it further e acted. That five perfons be elected by the joint ballot of both houses of the General Affembly, and they or a majority of them, are hereby authorifed and di rected to caufe to be built and erect. ed on the most proper lot, or part of the public lots, a statehoufe, fufficiently large to accommodate with con venience both houses of the General Affembly when fitting on public buff nefs; and they are hereby required o have the fame built on fuch a plan that additions may be hereafter conveniently made when neceffary: And the Governor for the time being is hereby authorifed and required to iffue warrants on the Treafurer, from time to time in favour of the faid Commiffioners as he may be request. ed by them or a majority of them, for the purpose of discharging the expence of building the said state. house, taking security for dou le the fum so drawn for the faithful application of the fame as by this act directed. Provided neverthelefs, That the whole amount of warrants fo drawn fhall not exceed the fum of ten thousand pounds. And the said first mentioned Commissioners are directed to make or caufe to be made a plan of the faid town; and the faid lat mentioned Commissioners shall make or caufe to be made a plan of the ftate-house, together with a plan of fuch other public huildings as they may deem proper and necessary to be hereafter built; and they full ly the fame and all their proceedings re fpectively under this act b fore the next General Affembly; and each and every of the Commissioners shall be allowed for their trouble and ex

the authority aforefaid. That the place which the faid Commissioners or a majority of them, shall so de termine on, shall be the feat of government, and the unalterable place of bolding the future affemblies of this ftate, and the place of refidence of the chief officers of the ftate, "greeable to the true intent and meani g of the recommendation of the General Affembly, and the ordinance of the Convention herein before mertioned. Provided always, That until convenient buildings can ha sreeted on the faid place for the purposes aforelaid, the General Affinb'v from time to time fhall have power to appoint any other place or places for the meeting of the General Affembly and for the refidence of the chief officers of the ftate, notwithftanding this law.
