ELECTION RETURNS.

According to the New York Sun the Australian ballot system prevails in a more or less complete form in the following twenty eight States of the Union: Arkansas, California, Connecticut, Deleware, Indiana, Minnesota, Maine, Michigan, Missouri, Montana. Maryland, Nebraska, New Hampshire North Dakota New York, New Jersey, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsyl vania, Rhode Island, Tennessee, South Dakota, Illinois, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Washington, Wyoming and Vermont.

All these States except New York New Jersey and Connecticut provide for a "blanket" ballot. The Australian rule of putting candidates' names on the callot in alphabetical order under the titles of offices obtains in Califorina, Mass chusetts, Montana, should arst subscribe for his home paper Island, Tennessee, Washington, Wyoming and Vermont. The Belgian system of grouping party tickets (where a party device or symbol is used) is followed in Delaware, Indiana, Maine, Maryland, Missouri, Ohio and Wisconsin.

Election officers (except in a few of the States named) will not be able to separate 'the straight tickets" into heaps and count them per annum in advance.
