They assailed Dr. Sanderlin with the most outrageous epithets but the Poctor persisted in making his speech, hurling defiance at his assailants. The confusion, became general when a crowd of the adherents from the outside attempted to make their way into the court house. They were met at the door and a desperate fight en sued with knives, pistols, blucgeons &c The ring, leader "Parrot" was wounded so badly that he died and many others both of the peaceable citizens and the outlaws were dan gerously hurt.
