Appropriation.

The matter of an appropriation on the part of North Carolina to the World's Fair is attracting attention. The following from the Raleigh correspondence of the Wilmington Messenger is to the point:

The next legislature will be called upon to do something the last one failed to do—that is to make an appropriation for the North Carolina exhibit at the World's Fair. The legislature owes it to the honor of the state to do this. The last legislature gave \$25,000, but it was "other people's money," as Gov. Holt very properly decided. The next legislature should promptly appropriate at least the same sum. All the preparatory work in the making of the grand collection has been done thanks to the board of agriculture, whose members most pluckily stepped into the breach and saw that the work should be prosecuted, and which lent the World's Fair Commission enough money to push the work to the present advanced stage.
