

Horrible Murder.

News of a most horrible murder has just been received. It was committed last Friday night near Siler City in Chatham county. The Graham Gleason says: The victims of the foul deed were Mr. Adam Siler, aged about 80 years, and his wife, a few years younger. They were at home alone and the first to discover them was their little grandson, aged 8 or 10 years, on his return from school. Both had been shot, Mr. Siler having been shot three times and Mrs. Siler twice. It is supposed they were murdered for their money, but it is believed the robber murderers secured very little money, as Mr. Siler, though quite well to do, had very little money on hand. Mr. and Mrs. Siler were buried Sunday in the same grave. At the coroner's inquest no clue was found as to who committed the foul deed.

What the Matter Was With Anthony.

The Roanoke (Weldon) News says: Monday morning Capt. Farmer of the Coast Line passenger train running from Plymouth to Rocky Mount shot and wounded Anthony, the colored railway postal clerk on duty on his train. Anthony was habitually impudent and meddlesome and frequently tried the patience of conductors. He was very impudent Monday morning and so exasperated Capt. Farmer, who is a quiet, inoffensive man, that the latter shot him, the ball striking his forehead obliquely and glancing inflicting only a scalp wound. Capt. Farmer then got Anthony's head under his arm and was about to shoot him in the head again, when the express agent rushed in and prevented him, undoubtedly saving the negro's life. The wound is not considered dangerous.

State School Superintendent.

Noble, Wilmington, "Value of Pomer in the School Room." Addresses were also made by Dr. Shearer and Prof. McIver.

Death of E. B. Drake.

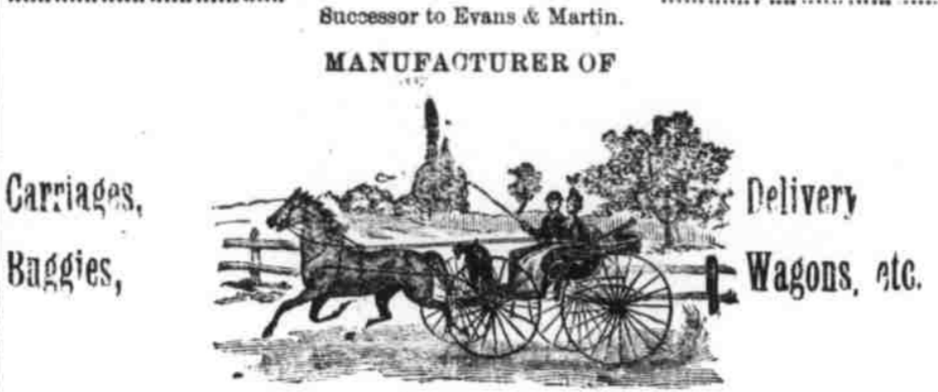
