Whereas，every interest of our atate Is justly entitled to the fairest equal ization of taxation that it is possible to provide；and whereas，it is well known and coneoded that the mer chants have long been subjected to a special tax which is bardensome known as＂The Parchase Tax，＂ which tax，besides being anreason－ able and unuecessary，is likewise dis oriminating in our political economy of a particular interest and oscapa－
tion to the exelueion of other classes business，While there is no clesire intention to in any way embarrass the aggregate of taxation necessary to provide sumciant funds for the proper administration of public af fairs，we believe that the collection of the purchase tax is now no longer necessary，therefore，be it，
Resolved，That the flannee commit mittees of the general ausembly be respectfully petilioned to recommend to the leg：blature that the preser law authorizing the levying and ool leetion of the purchase tax beren pealed．
