Mad Dogs.

In view of the fact that there is several years some excitement in the country about mad dogs, we give the law upon the subject, as follows:

"When the owner of any dog shall know, or have good reason to believe that his dog, or any dog belonging to any person under his control has been bitten by a mad dog, and shall neglect or refuse immeliately to kill the same, he shall forfeit and pay the ROSES, PALMS, ETC. I have sum of \$50 to him who will sue therefor; and the offender shall be liable to pay all damages which may be susperson. by the bite of any dog be- egg plant, cauliflower, etc. longing as aforesaid, and shall te guilty of a misdemeanor and fined not more than \$50, or imprisoned not more than 30 days."
