### CITY IN BRIEF.

We regret to learn that Judge Walter Clark is confined to his home with sickness.

The Norfolk excursionists returned this morning well pleased with their trip.

The First National Bank of Winston is being organized and will soon be ready for business.

The merry-go-round has been placed in Brookside Park. It will be in full operation tonight.

Gov Carr has issued a reward of \$300 for the capture of the murderer of Backus in Buneombe.

The Western Union are talking about moving their office to the new opera house. It will be a fine place.

No stranger should visit Raleigh and not see our beautiful state library. It is daily being augmented by portraits and relics and is indeed a most interesting place.

An appeal has been made to the students of Rutherford College to all the living students to aid financially in meeting a mortgage debt of \$1,700 upon the college due this month.

There will be an important meeting of the Cross Bearer Circle of the Kings Daughters tomorrow afternoon (Thursday) at 5 o'clock, at Mrs. Foster's. Every member is urged to be present.

Mrs F S Williams and little son Leon, of Norfolk, Va, arrived yesterday on the R & G morning train and will spend several days on a visit to the family of Mr T C Williams, 313 Oakwood avenue.

G D Hodgkin and L L Lunn, surviving partners of the late firm of Hodgkin Bros & Lunn, of Winston, have made an assignment. The total amount of preferred credits is \$50,282.05; assets are about \$75,000.

There seems to be a general feeling of confidence that the approaching session of congress will again restore the pecuniary condition of the country to its usual channel, and that the business outlook this fall will be very bright.

United States Marshal Hill will soon levy on the property of the Macdon-Arrington gold mining property in Nash county against which the people of Pittsburg, Pa, have secured a judgment for \$52,000. A sale will be made under execution.

The meeting of the W O T U's at Mr J H Eunice's, yesterday evening, was well attended. Mrs Winston was re-elected president and Mrs Worth treasurer. Miss Emma White was elected secretary and Mrs Emma White, corresponding secretary. A vice president from each church was elected. Superintendents of the various departments were appointed.

We are reliably informed that Evangelist Weston R. Gales will hold a meeting in Raleigh the early part of October, when it is hoped that all the churches and christian workers will unite in a consecrated and persevering effort to win souls for Christ. We believe the above fact will be gratifying to Mr. Gale's many friends in the city.

Rev L L Nash D D., pastor of Fifth Street M E Church, South, of Wilmington, N C, and editor of The Atlantic Methodist stopped over in Raleigh, on his way from Durham district conference, at Roxboro, to the district conference of the Warren-district at Littleton N C. Dr Nash is canvassing in the interest of his church. He is succeeding finely in adjusting and paying the enormous debt with which that church is burdened, and he is hopeful that he will be able to get the debt in imitable shape by the session of the conference which will meet there on the 6th day of next December. He has succeeded in bonding the largest debt owed by the church for ten years at four per cent, and will no doubt arrange the remainder satisfactorily at an early day.

### Convention.

The Sunday school convention of Albemarle Presbytery convened in Goldsboro last night and the sessions will continue through today and tomorrow, and a large number of Sunday school workers are expected to be present and take part in the discussion of important subjects connected with this great branch of christian work. Albemarle Presbytery embraces Washington, N C, New Berne, Kinston, Tarboro, Goldsboro, Raleigh, Henderson, Oxford, Littleton, Warrenton, Weldon and Elizabeth City. Mr A M McPheeters and others are expected to attend from this city.

### Crop Reports.

The reports of correspondents show that all crops have made good progress. The rainfall was generally beneficial. Correspondents from the central and western parts of the state report rain needed, but it is thought that rain occurred in nearly all sections on Saturday or Sunday (after the reports were mailed). The last few days of the week were warm and generally clear. This was especially beneficial to cotton, causing it to grow and also having the effect of driving off lice. The trouble from cotton lice seems to have abated considerably. Hail occurred on the 3d, 6th and 7th doing considerable damage to crops over small areas of country. A large majority of correspondents report corn as very good, tobacco fairly good, oats excellent, hay very good, cotton considerably improved.
