Plague of Grasshoppers.

A plague of grasshoppers has struck
 Western New York. The grasshop-
 pers began to come in clouds a little
 over a week ago, but it was not
 thought to be much more than the
 usual summer visitation, slightly in-
 creased. Within a day or so following,
 however, the grasshoppers increased
 so as to excite alarm. The oat crop,
 which in the early season promised
 to be unusually prolific, is a failure.
 The hoppers have eaten the heads off
 the stalks, cleaning out whole fields.
 The silk has been taken off the green
 corn and the leaves and husks have
 been cut all to pieces. Whole fields of
 cabbage have been destroyed. The
 pear and peach orchards have also
 suffered to a large extent.
