The crop report for the week ending yesterday shows in the eastern district excessive rains during the first three days which injured the cotton considerably and a great many acres of corn along the lowlands of Roanoke river, the cotton, however, is well bolted though the stalk is small. Other crops doing well.

In the central district the damp weather has caused a second growth of tobacco, cotton not opening fast and picking not general so far.

In the western district cotton picking has become general. Some corn rotting from continued rains.
