## The Weather.

For North Carolina: Decidedly colder.

Local forecast for Raleigh and vicinity.

On Sunday: Fair; much colder by Sunday night.

Local data for 24 hours ending 8 a m today.

Maximum temperature, 71; minimum temperature, 58; rainfall 0.00.

Synopsis: The storm is now central over the lake region, the barometer being lowest at Marquette. Snow or rain is falling at many places in the north.

The pressure has risen in the south considerably, and in the west very rapidly. The center of the area of pressure is over Dakota and Nebraska.

The temperature has fallen ten and twenty degrees in the central and western portions of the country.

This morning it is generally clear, or partly cloudy, in the south and west. It is probable that the high pressure and colder weather will prevail in the Atlantic States by Sunday night.

## The Normal School.
