Quite a number of strangers are in the city to attend the big horse sale of Mr B P Williamson, which takes place tomorrow.

Mr Joel D Whitaker, of Tuscaloosa, Ala., is in the city in attendance upon the big horse sale which is to take place tomorrow and next day.

Hands are busily at work in the capitol square today cleaning off all rubbish and making other necessary arrangements preparatory to sowing it down in grasses.
