## SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

Bright Prospects for a First Class Electric Railway.

A special meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held last night for the purpose of considering the matter of declaring the franchise of the present street railway company forfeited. Mr George, the receiver of the old company made no proposition, but desired no action to be taken as it would injure the sale of the road to take place in April. His views were supported by R T Gray, attorney, and R S Tucker. Mr O M Busbee, as attorney for Messrs Frank P Lewis and S D Davidson offered a proposition to build, equip and operate an electric railway which would be first class in all particulars and equal to any in the United States. They will give a sufficient guarantee that the contract should be carried out.

This looks like business. A committee was appointed to consider the proposition, consisting of Aldermen Stronach, Womble, Cross, Bowes and Johnson.
