So far about fifty sheriffs have settled in full with the State Treasury. Consul General Jernigan will leave for his post of duty about March 15th.

No particular granite has yet been selected for the Confederate monument.

It is expected that sufficient funds will be obtained to finish the monument to the late Col Polk, by next January.

Only one state officer will have to be elected this year. This is the State Treasurer, as Col Tate was appointed under the law until the next general election.

A picnic and barbecue will be given at Moore's pond on Easter Monday by Rev James Alston. Boating, fishing &c, will be the order of the day.
