C., Jan. 23 - The gun boat Machias has arrived at Bangkok under orders to protect American interests, having been hurried there from Hong Kong, 2,000 miles away on receipt of official news at the State department last week of an attack by Siamese soldiers on United States Deputy Consul-General Kellett. Commander Me Kenzie will confer with Minister Barrett, and if the circumstances warrant, a salute to the American flag will be demanded. The announcement that the Machias had been ordered to Bangkok has already had the effect of materially altering the attitude of the Siamese government to the United States.
