After inspecting the exposition grounds the party was taken aboard one of the Southern Railway's tug boats making a tour of Norfolk harbor, and viewing the Southern terminals at Piper's Point, returning to Norfolk at 7:00 p. m., where a sumptuous banquet was served at the Monticello Hotel.
