TO CONTINUE HIS SALARY

W. R. Murray, whose sentence was changed to Two Years in Jail, Will Try to Obtain His Sentence from the Court.

(Special to the Evening Times.) Durham, N. C., Oct. 25.—W. R. Murray, under sentence to serve two years in the jail of Durham county, this modification of his sentence from two years on the public roads having been made by the Governor and announced yesterday, is making every preparation to begin his sentence Thursday morning, this being the time to which he had previously been committed by Governor Glenn. The news of the Governor's action was a shock to Murray and his friends, but there is no criticism.

Murray thinks it hard on him, but has no criticism of any one and is ready to begin his sentence. He was cheerful last night and his only talk was of making arrangements for the inevitable. He is still president of the W. R. Murray Company and will hold that position, with salary, during his confinement. From his cell he will keep in as close touch with his business as possible and his daily mail will be a report from his home showing every detail of what has been done and sending him duplicate contracts of everything transacted for his concern. If possible he intends keeping a duplicate set of books in his little cell and will serve his time in the best possible spirit and with as much profit to himself and business as possible.

GOVERNOR OFFERS REWARD.

Case of Brutality in Wilkes County. His Excellency May Go to Washington in November.

Governor Glenn to-day offered a reward of \$150 for the apprehension and arrest of John A. Huffman, of Wilkes county, who so severely abused his wife, by beating her and inflicting severe injuries about her person. The affair happened about two or three months ago, and apprehension has so far been impossible, on which account the reward is now offered.

The Governor this morning received a telegram from Mr. Henry B. P. McFarland, calling him to Washington City, for a meeting of the inauguration committee, which will be held November 8th, for the purpose of considering the change of Inauguration Day from March 4th to a season of milder weather. Governor Glenn has not yet decided to accept.

Marvin Hart, the champion heavy-weight pugilist, yesterday accepted the offer of the Colima Club, of San Francisco, for a match with Al Kaufman. The club's offer, made through Billy Roche, calls for an unlimited round fight for a purse of \$15,000, is contingent on Kaufman winning over Jack O'Brien in San Francisco Friday night.
