CACERO PRESIDENT OF SAN DOMINGO

(By the Associated Press.)
Washington, Dec. 27.—Cable advices at the State Department from San Domingo today say to the effect that the cabinet has taken over the government and named Vice President Cacero as the successor of President Morales, who is with the revolutionists about ten miles from the capital.

The Navy Department today received a brief dispatch from Puerto Plata, San Domingo, announcing the departure from that port for Monte Cristi of the gunboat Paducah. No details of her mission have yet been received. The gunboat Paducah left Norfolk today for Monte Cristi. The Navy Department has advised Rear Admiral Bradford of her departure, and that she will be at his disposal as soon as she arrives in Dominican waters. The Paducah is a sister ship to the Dubuque, and will be attached to the squadron guarding American interests in the West Indies.

SHOT BECAUSE SHE WOULDN'T DANCE.

Mt. Sterling, Ky., Dec. 27.—Mrs. Florence Watson, wife of Henry Watson, a prominent local merchant, was mortally wounded early today at a dance by John Flaherty, a young farmer, with whom she refused to dance. Mrs. Watson was shot in the back and will die. Flaherty was a suitor for Mrs. Watson's hand before her marriage.

SHOT SWEETHEART AND HIMSELF.

Springfield, Ohio, Dec. 27.—Noah A. White shot his sweetheart, Ella Shook, today in the breast and also in the jaw, and she lay at the hospital in a dying condition. White then put a bullet into his brain, causing instant death.

Dr. R. W. Taylor Dead.

Columbia, S. C., Dec. 27.—Dr. R. W. Taylor, well known throughout South Carolina, died today of pneumonia, aged 72 years. His grandfather was a colonel in the Revolution. Dr. Taylor was a colonel in the Confederate army on General Hampton's staff, and was the chief surgeon in Charleston harbor at the fall of Fort Sumter. At the close of the war he was surgeon general of cavalry of the Army of Northern Virginia. At his death he was chairman of the regents of the State hospital.

Killed in Southern Yards.

Spartanburg, S. C., Dec. 27.—D. M. Hill and Richard Rogers, of Saxon Hill, S. C., and J. F. Stone, of Cross Anchor, were struck and instantly killed by a fast train of the Southern Railway in the yards here yesterday.

The accident occurred on a curve in the road above the Brawley street trestle. The men were walking on the west track towards the depot and to avoid an approaching freight stepped over to the east track when the fast northbound passenger running two hours and a half late struck them. All were badly mangled. Stone was a well-to-do farmer who came here to pay taxes.

The Pattishall Inquest.

Pittsboro, N. C., Dec. 27.—The coroner of Chatham county will on January 3 hold an inquest upon the bodies of Mrs. Emeline Pattishall and her daughter Josie, who died suddenly several weeks ago under peculiar circumstances, and whose stomachs were analyzed and found to contain arsenic. The coroner is directed to do this by the solicitor of this district. The inquest is to determine whether the deaths were accidental or criminal.

Shanghai Court Resumes.

Shanghai, Dec. 27.—British Assessor Twissman, resumed the sitting of the mixed court today with the police in attendance, but without any additional guard. Everything here is in a normal condition.

Schooner and Scow Collide.

New York, Dec. 27.—The schooner Bessie Whiting, lumber laden, from Port Royal for this port, was in collision with a scow off Sandy Hook lightship, and was towed into this port in a leaking condition today by a tug. The schooner also lost her foretopmast. The Whiting put into Delaware Breakwater December 22 with the loss of some sails.

Yerkes is Not Dead.

New York, Dec. 27.—At the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel today, it was stated that Charles T. Yerkes, the street railway financier who is very ill, is somewhat better than he has been. It was denied that he is in a dying condition.
