TRY BROTHER'S KEEPER GREENE & GAYNOR LOSE

Saloon Keepers Must Pay Drunkard's Children Fine Legal

A Chicago Jury Awards \$17,000 Damages Against Lagoon Now Alleged to Have Made a Drunkard of the Father—A Precedent Established.

(By the Associated Press.)
Chicago, Jan. 11.—Damages in \$17,000 were awarded by a jury to the children of a drunken father for redress against the saloon keepers alleged to have made a drunkard of him.

The verdict, establishing a precedent which will result in the institution of many similar suits, was rendered in Judge Tulliff's court. The plaintiffs were the five children of John Hedlund, and the defendants Oscar Gever, Louis Lundquist and Bruce Thores, saloon keepers. The verdict is against them separately and jointly.

SETON TO TOMBS WITHOUT BAIL

(By the Associated Press.)
New York, Jan. 11.—C. Augustus Seton, the promoter who was arrested in Turkeytown, Md., Wednesday night, charged with being a fugitive from justice under a charge of grand larceny and who is alleged to have been concerned with Samuel Humphreys in negotiating the forged securities of the Norfolk & Western Railroad Company, was committed to the Tombs prison today without bail.

When Seton was arraigned before Recorder Goff today Assistant District Attorney Geyron asked the recorder to fix the bail at \$25,000. He said that the prisoner is now under indictment for grand larceny charged to the amount of \$10,000, and that other charges are pending against him for grand larceny and forgery aggregating \$25,000. He said Seton was a wealthy man and that in August last he had a yacht in New York harbor and was about to set sail for South America to escape jurisdiction.

Counsel for Seton declared that his client was not a fugitive from justice when arrested in Maryland, and not required to appear until next Monday. The other charges, he said, were mere vagaries.

DECATUR MAY BE DISMISSED

Annapolis, Md., Jan. 12.—E. S. Theall, of Washington, D. C., addressed the court martial this morning in behalf of Midshipman Stephen Decatur, Jr., Judge Advocate Harrison stated the case of the prosecution and the case was given to the court.

The case is the second one of being against Decatur which the present court has tried. It is generally apprehended that the accused is in grave danger of conviction of the charge of hazarding fourth class man Charles C. W. Malley by having him bring him his breakfast to his room and of "encouraging or countenancing" the hazarding of Gayford Church, who he admitted was ordered to do the "sixteenth" in his presence.

STRENGTHENERS AWAY END OF FUGITIVE TRACK

(By the Associated Press.)
Chicago, Jan. 11.—The Lake Superior Association, West, representing 250 firms, representing 1,000 men, closed its semi-annual convention here yesterday. It was decided to appoint a committee to meet with the United States, who will hold a convention in Buffalo, N. Y., January 24, for the purpose of considering a demand for the 48-hour week.

The employing lithographers and their attitude on the question of hours will be determined by the result of the fight of the United Typographical Union against the Union printers. It is held that unless the 48-hour week is agreed to in the allied trades it would be suicidal to the interests of lithographers to grant the Union demands. On the other hand most of the employers express willingness to meet the demands of the men in the event of the Typographical Union winning its fight with the Typographical Union.

Prominent Mexican Dead

Monterey, Mex., Jan. 12.—General Ramon Terraz, commander of the military zone including the State of Nueva Leon, Coahuila and Tamaulipas, died at his residence in this city yesterday.

He took a prominent part in the struggle against the forces of Maximilian.
