Furnish Battery Artillery.

Governor Glenn has received from General Francis A. Macon, quartermaster general of the State militia, who was in Washington, D. C., attending the meeting of the National Guard, a telegram stating that he had made an application to the War Department for battery artillery, and that the request was granted, the battery being obtained free of charge. It will consist of four pieces.

The telegram did not state whether the battery was for the field or stationary, but if it is stationary it will in all probability be located at Morehead City, the permanent encampment grounds of the North Carolina National Guard.

Cotton Seed Oil.

"The cotton oil mills," said a broker yesterday, "are closing down. Not over one-third of the oil mills in Alabama are now running. The early closing is due to a great extent to the seed shortage, which has sent up the price by leaps and bounds. Over in Mississippi the mills are now paying \$20 a ton, and the prospects are that an advance to \$22.50 or perhaps \$25 will be established and maintained.

"The products of cotton seed have, of course, been advanced. In New Orleans meal has been jumped up to \$31.50 a ton, and oil in tanks is selling at 25 cents a gallon. There are considerable advances, and yet they are not sufficient to enable the oil mills to make such money. Few mills will be able to show this year a margin of profit on the season's business.—Birmingham Age-Herald.
