CHARGE OF INFIBELTY

(By Leased Wire to The Times.) New York, May 21.—Steps were taken today toward criminal prosecution of the men whom Mrs. Howard Gould charges with conspiring to blacken her character in her divorce suit against the millionaire son of Jay Gould.

The conference which was arranged today between Police Commissioner Bingham and District Attorney Jerome corroborated the reports that such action would follow the revelations which came after "Big Bill" Hawley, ex-convict and professional perjurer, sued Howard Gould and his lawyer, Delancey Nicoll, for professional services "in getting evidence against Mrs. Gould."

Non-Support, Neglect, Humiliation. Non-support is the third allegation. In September of last year Gould is alleged to have discontinued providing Mrs. Gould with funds.

She declares that she has frequently been shamed and humiliated by the open manner in which he has associated with other women while she has been neglected.

STRANGE'S BODY EXHUMED TODAY

Stomach Taken Out and Will be Analyzed

MRS. ROWLAND ON BOND

There were no new developments today in the Dr. Rowland murder case other than the body of Engineer Charles R. Spinger, who died on April 6, was exhumed, the stomach taken out and the contents will be analyzed by Prof. W. A. Withers of the A. & M. College.

The body of Engineer Spinger was in a dreadful condition, which was expected as he had been dead nearly two months. His body was exhumed at the instigation of a number of engineers.

The Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers has retained Messrs. Argo & Shaffer to prosecute Mrs. Rowland.

Dr. and Mrs. Rowland have both made the statement that they never met until the morning on which Engineer Spinger died, and that Dr. Rowland was then called in after an effort to get other physicians.

COLLISION NEAR ROANOKE RIVER

Rear End Collision Between Two Seaboard Freights

OCURRED LAST NIGHT

Pass Track Was Built Around Wreckage and First Trains Passed This Afternoon—Several Trains Detained Via of Selma—No One Hurt in the Accident.

There was a rear-end collision last night at eight o'clock between two northbound Seaboard freights at Tholma, a small station just this side of the Roanoke river. One train was standing at the station waiting for orders when the second freight dashed into it from the rear.

When the engineer and fireman saw that a wreck was inevitable both of them jumped and thus escaped injury. Engineer Finlater is in charge of the rear train.

The wrecking train was sent to the scene of the wreck soon after it occurred, but the track was damaged to such an extent and so much debris piled up that up to this afternoon it had not been cleared.

FIRE IN MIDST OF LAKE

When nearly in mid-lake fire was discovered last week decks in the foreward hold and in spite of desperate efforts of those aboard the flames swept the whole length of the ship and the upper works burned like tinder.

The Naomi's cargo is a total loss, its charred hull being all that remains of the beautiful craft.
