HEBREW POETRY BEST

Bishop Parker, Who Delivers Two Entertaining Discourses, Devotes Some Time to Comparing the Literatures of the Hebrews and Gentiles—Why Psalms Are More Enduring.

The Rt. Rev. Edward M. Parker, D. D., bishop coadjutor of Vermont, delivered two learned discourses in this city yesterday.

Bishop Parker rendered a very learned dissertation on the Psalms at Christ Church last night. His text was taken from Luke 24:44, "And in the Psalms concerning me."

He did not, however, confine himself to any one passage of scripture, but, saying that he deemed it helpful sometimes to look at a book of the Bible as a whole, gave a very thoughtful criticism of the Psalms in their entirety.

In the second place Bishop Parker noticed the position of the Psalms in human history. Here, as all through the discourse, he made copious references to passages which confirmed his position.

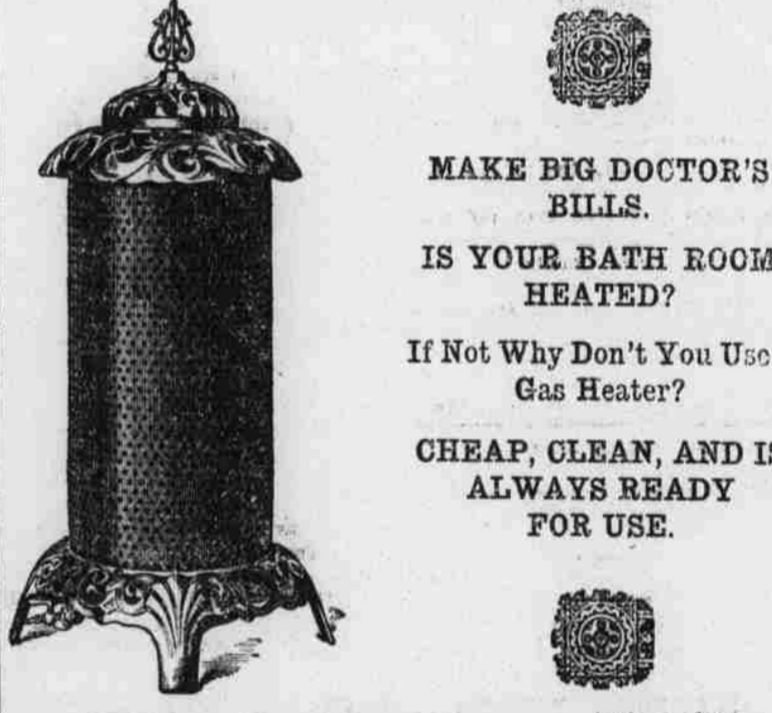
