## BIG INCREASE

(By Leased Wire to The Times.) Washington, Dec. 24-The immigration statement for the month of November, made public by F. P. Sargent, commissioner-general of immigration and naturalization, shows a surprising increase in the inward passenger movement.

The total number of immigrants from all countries landed in the United States for the month of November was 117,476, as compared with 94,621 for the corresponding month last year, and 61.374 for November, 1905. This is an increase of 91 per cent. over 1905, and 24 per cent. over 1906.
