

NEW BERN IS NOW IN LEAGUE

Rocky Mount Withdraws on Account of Protection

NEXT MEETING IN CITY

Directors to Meet Here April 6 to Perfect Schedule—Pay of Umpires Increased—Raleigh Club Leases A. and M. Baseball Park—Looking Out for Good Players.

Instead of Rocky Mount it is now New Bern.

At a meeting of the directors of the Eastern Carolina League, held at Goldsboro last evening, Rocky Mount declined to be governed by the rules of the national association and New Bern was taken in by a vote of five to one. The meeting was enthusiastic and every club put up the required guarantee of \$300. The pay of the umpire was increased from \$5.50 to \$6.50 a game.

Fayetteville was ready to come in, but it was known that Rocky Mount would kick out and that city did not have a representative present. The next meeting will be held in Raleigh, April 6.

The Raleigh club has leased the A. & M. College baseball park for the season and the games in this city will be played there. Manager Kelly has already signed Mr. Will Wynne, of this city, who will play second base, and the manager has his eyes open for other good men.

Messrs. Cox and Gattis, who have returned from Goldsboro, are enthusiastic over the prospects of good baseball for the season.

name for this nomination, and the press kindly took it up. When the convention met I was about to be nominated, but some one suggested that one farmer ought to be on the ticket, and one was nominated. Four years ago I was desirous of the nomination, but withdrew on learning that the gentleman who had sought to befriend me, himself desired it. As the present incumbent will probably not seek a third term I ask your favor.

"I have always been a platform democrat, and as to new issues not covered by the platform, I have been conservative.

"Perhaps I should say that a year ago, when the two-cent rate was proposed, I thought it too low a cut, and sought to dissuade from it. Later I urged Governor Glenn to attend the meeting of governors at Atlanta; and I consider that the legislature did well in settling the matter at the special session.

"The affairs of the state treasury, I believe, are in such an excellent condition that all that is requisite is the attention of a careful, painstaking man, and I hope that I can discharge the duties satisfactorily. "I will be thankful for any aid you may give me."

THE FIRST GAME MONDAY

To Be Unusually Good Season For Baseball, as Boys Are Busily at Work—Outdoor Exercise For All Students—Some of the Candidates For the Team—The Schedule.

The greatest enthusiasm is being manifested in athletics by the students of Centennial and High Schools. The out-door gymnasium that has been installed is being enjoyed to the utmost by the girls and boys. Their activity is not confined to school hours, as from early morn 'till dewy eve can they be seen in large crowds on the campus swinging, playing basket-ball, throwing the hammer, performing on bars, etc.

As might be expected at this season of the year baseball is the most popular sport. A large number of boys are trying for positions on the High School team, which promises to be the best team ever put out by that institution. Baldwin and Stafford will alternate at short. Leland Harris, Sidney Holman, and Carl Betts are all trying third base. As out-fielders, Charles Newcomb, Lem Yerby, Herman Briggs, Victor Spruill, Julian Timberlake, Needham Broughton, Arthur Taylor, Mark Chamberlain, and Hubert Wyatt are all practising.

A good long schedule has been arranged, and the boys hope to win the championship.
