Washington, Aug. 22—Forecast for North Carolina for tonight and Sunday.

Partly cloudy, with local showers tonight or Sunday; light to fresh west to northwest winds.

The northwest high is now central weather, the temperature being 38° at Bismarck, N. Dak. The depression central over Lake Superior is now over the eastern lakes. It has caused somewhat higher temperatures east of the Mississippi river and north of the Ohio. Rains fell generally in the Atlantic coast states and Southern states, being especially heavy at Raleigh and Hatteras, N. C., and at Galveston, Tex. The weather in the cotton belt is cloudy, and the temperatures have remained unchanged.

The conditions indicate partly cloudy with local showers tonight or Sunday in this vicinity.

BUGGY AND MAIL LOST

Bridge Over Bordon's Creek Washed Away

Rural Mail Carrier Tries to Cross Swollen Stream and is Washed Down the Stream—Horse Found Half Mile From Scene of Accident.

Mr. Sherron, acting as rural carrier on the route from Lillian, in Oak Grove township, this county, connected with the Raleigh carrier at Leesville yesterday and on the way from Leesville to Rogers' Store, the two had to cross Barton's creek. All of the streams were swollen and Barton's Creek was all out on the banks. Sherron drove on the bridge, and as he was half way across the bridge gave way, and the bridge, horse and buggy, mail and all went down the creek.

The carrier swam to the other side and pulled himself out. The horse managed to break loose and the buggy and was found a half mile down the creek. The buggy and mail were lost entirely.

All of the streams of that section are swollen badly. The carrier, supplying that section of the county, was forced to return to the office today on account of a creek being too deep to ford.
