Among the stocks distinguishing themselves were Reading at 157%, Delaware & Hudson at 193, Brooklyn Transit 80 ¼, Consolidated Gas at 140%, Missouri Pacific 176, Rock Island at 31 3-8, American Car 13% and the preferred at \$2%. Even Erie made a high record, selling up to 35 on very heavy transactions. All these records were made in the first half hour of trading and most




