

MAY SEND A CUTTER AFTER MISSING AGENT

(By Leased Wire to The Times.) Washington, Aug. 24-At the department of commerce and labor this morning it was said that the expected report of Walter B. Lembke the department's agent at the Pribyloff Islands showing the number of fur seals killed this year by the lessees of the islands, the North American, Commercial Company, and which should have been in Washington not later than August 10 is still missing. "The reason for its non-arrival is a mystery to this department," said one official.
