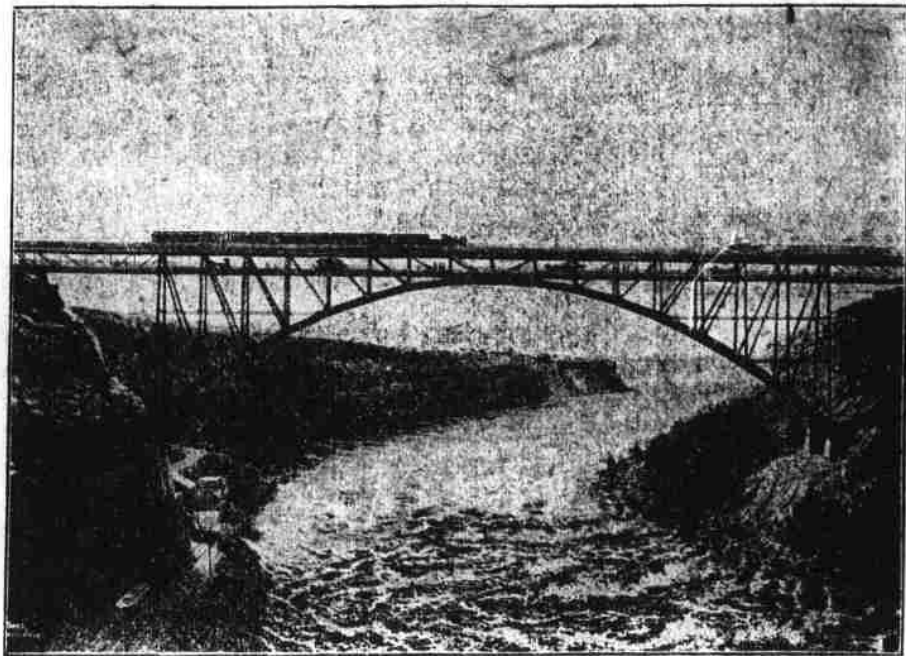


SINGLE TRACK STEEL BRIDGE ACROSS NIAGARA BRIDGE.

SUMMER CAPITAL NEWS

Henry Clay Frick Playing Mine Host

Several Government Officials Have Made and Will Make Their Headquarters at the Frick Home This Summer—Other Government News.

(By Leased Wire to The Times) Beverly, Mass., Aug. 24—Henry Clay Frick, of Pittsburg, who has expended \$2,000,000 on his summer place, Eagle Rock, at Prides Crossing, told the newspaper contingent here today that he believes the expense was justified because he is able now to watch the movements of his neighbor, President Taft, from his high terrace that looks down on the presidential lawn.

TORPEDO BOAT FLUSSER.

Is Now Swiftest Boat in the American Navy. Washington, Aug. 24—Reports to the navy department say that the new United States torpedo boat Flusser, one of the new boats now building for the navy, had her preliminary builders' trial on the course off Rockland, Me., last week. She made a speed of 31.03 knots, which makes her the swiftest vessel in the American navy. The best previous record for speed was about 29 knots. Torpedo boats in the British navy, however, have made as high as 32 knots an hour.

MAY SEND A CUTTER AFTER MISSING AGENT

(By Leased Wire to The Times.) Washington, Aug. 24—At the department of commerce and labor this morning it was said that the expected report of Walter B. Lembke the department's agent at the Fribyloff Islands showing the number of fur seals killed this year by the lessees of the islands, the North American Commercial Company, and which should have been in Washington not later than August 10 is still missing. "The reason for its non-arrival is a mystery to this department," said one official. "It may be due to the fact that there has been serious trouble between representatives of the United States the foreign seal pouchers, most probably Japanese. If nothing is heard from special agent Lembke within a few days it is possible the department may send a revenue cutter to the islands from Sitka, the nearest point there for the purpose of making an investigation of the reason for the delay. Seward is out of telegraphic communication with the islands."
