The local team has played two games this season and in each they have made an excellent showing, the work of Coach S. Clay Williams, a

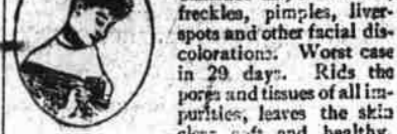
