## THE OTHERS OBJECT

### Defeated Candidates For Post-office Raise a Howl

Meeting Called for Tonight in Office of Underwood, Efforts Will Be Made to Have Giles Kicked Out and One of the Other Candidates Placed in Durham Postoffice—All Agreed on Point Now—Matter Far From Settlement Yet—Work on Religious Training School.

(Special to The Times.) Durham, N. C., March 7.—In the office of N. Underwood, police commissioner tonight, there is to be held a meeting of the defeated faithful in the recent postoffice contest, in which there will be uttered protest against the appointment of J. A. Giles as postmaster of Durham.

Congressman Morehead, after a bitter fight among five avowed candidates, settling upon the County Chairman, J. A. Giles as a compromise candidate. Up to that time Mr. Giles was supposed to have had the greatest individual preference for John T. Pope, who had the field against him and broke even with it. Finding Pope unable to beat the combination, Mr. Morehead named the county chairman who is also assistant district attorney.

The program is exciting. All of the candidates will be asked there to agree upon one of those who actually made the fight. Upon the part of a few there is acquiescence. Mr. Pope agrees that when the congressman and the president of the United States agree upon a man, there is small room for a fight on his account. But Joseph K. Mason, whose strong fight against Pope kept the gentleman from landing, is willing for the County Chairman, and hearts fall for the postoffice matter. He has decided the greatest financial backing in the personal of his followers they are expected to have some hot things to say.

Further than admission that such a meeting is to be held tonight, the Mason men will not talk. For it is said by republicans that the postoffice matter is far from settlement even if the congressman has recommended Mr. Giles and that there is possibility even if the president appoints the assistant district attorney that the matter will be held up.

The Durham Daily Sun has signed up Hill A. Gardner of the Columbia, S. C. Record, as its business manager and Mr. Gardner will be here in two weeks to take charge.

James A. Robinson, who has been twenty-one years the editor and owner of the paper, has been at the head of the paper since its reorganization and says that he will continue. The first issue with Mr. Gardner, the new Cox-Duplex and the linotype will appear about April first.
