## NEW BANK STARTED

### Bank of Hobgood Will Open December First

Bank Organized Tuesday With T. J. Baker as President—Quarterly Conference—News Notes.

(Special to The Times.) Scotland Neck, Nov. 17.—The Bank of Hobgood was organized on Tuesday, the 15th, when the stockholders met in the new bank building there, and elected Mr. T. J. Baker, of Palmyra, president, and Mr. E. P. Hyman, of Hobgood, cashier.

The following are the directors: R. J. Shields, Dr. K. Leggett, S. D. Bradley, W. P. White, W. R. House, W. C. Alshbrook, L. J. Baker, W. G. Hedgcock, Enoch Simmons, Justus Everett, and those composing the finance committee are S. D. Bradley, R. J. Shields, Dr. K. Leggett, W. P. White, W. G. Hedgcock. The bank will begin business about December 15th with a paid in capital of \$5,000, with a privilege of increasing it to \$7,500. There was a call at the organization for fifty per cent. of the shares, which are \$50 each, but many of the stockholders paid in full, so enthusiastically were they over the new enterprise.

There was a large crowd of visitors present besides the stockholders, and citizens of Hobgood had prepared a big public dinner for their guests, which they enjoyed immensely.

The committee of arrangements appointed by the Chamber of Commerce have been working assiduously and a very interesting program of the events for the day is the result. Several excursions were operated over the different railroads leading into the city and a record breaking crowd is here from all over the adjoining counties of this section. The corn exhibits and corn judging are being held in the large tobacco warehouse on the northern suburb of the city and a public oyster roast was tendered the visitors at the manufacturing plant of the Eureka Lumber Company. Six handsome solid silver loving cups awarded by Mr. C. H. Fuller, of Providence, R. I., and a number of handsome gifts given by a prominent northern manufacturer are among the prizes to be given for the best exhibits of corn on this day. There are also a number of other prizes given by local firms.

In the afternoon the Tar Heel Motor Boat Club will give a very interesting and exciting program of races between different speed boats in the club on Pamlico river for the benefit of the visitors.

### THANKSGIVING FOOTBALL GAME

A. & M. College of North Carolina vs. V. P. L. of Virginia Norfolk, Va., November 24th, 1910.
