

March 16, 1912-Forecast: For Raleigh and vicinity: Fair tonight and Sunday colder tonight with heavy frost. For North Carolina: Fair tonight, colder in central and east portions, heavy frost; Sunday fair; moderate north to northeast winds.

Weather Conditions: The disturbance of Friday morning has moved northeastward, attended by high winds and heavy rains, and this morning fair and colder weather covers the eastern district. Light to killing frosts formed last night in the southern states, except along the Texas coast and the extreme eastern states. Temperatures are much higher in the Plains states and portions of the southwest, in connection with a disturbance central over Wyoming; lower temperatures obtain in the far northwest.
